Eyes are the most precious organ in human body. World is dark without eyesight. If one's eyes are blindfolded for a while one can very well realize the importance and value of eyesight. Therefore, proper care of eyes is must. However, in rural area there is lack of awareness in this regard. That is why, incidence of cataract is higher. Villagers, normally consider it God's will and are reluctant to undergo surgery. Also, most of them can't afford the cost of surgery. With this fact in view, Sant Ji started organizing free camps. It is learned that Sewa Sadan Eye Hospital has organized 2947 eye camps in rural areas.

Eyesight's of a large number of people were damaged or lost in the wake of Bhopal gas tragedy in 1984. Sewa Sadan Eye Hospital was set up in 1987. So far, over 3 lakh eye surgeries have already been performed. This is a towering achievement of eye surgeons, para medical staff and volunteers engaged in this noble cause.

Besides, over 1904 eye transplantations have also been done so far. People who are blind get the rare opportunity to see the world. The devotion of volunteers during and after the camp is exemplary. Many of the patients break into tears to see the dedication of the volunteers. They say that even their own children can't minister to them with so much devotion and dedication. The services of the hospital are growing day by day due to its excellence and dedication to human cause. People prefer to undergo eye surgeries at this hospital. Swami ji said, "Those who help in restoring eye of people will get inner light kindled by God".

SSEH team in RAAB Survey

As part of a 6-month project between November 2021 – April 2022, a RAAB survey was carried out to find the prevalence of blindness including avoidable blindness due to cataract in Hoshangabad district of Madhya Pradesh. The primary objective was to determine the prevalence of blindness (including avoidable blindness) among the 50+ population in the district.



HIGHLIGHTS

RAAB Survey in Hoshangabad district

The survey was conducted in December 2021 over a period of 10 days screening over 2808 rural population. The survey was a collaboration between, CBM India, Dr. R.P. Centre, AIIMS, Delhi and Sewa Sadan Eye Hospital.

The survey was led by Dr. Praveen Vashist, Head, Community Ophthalmology, Dr. R.P. Centre, AIIMS. A team of ophthalmologists and optometrists from Dr. R.P. Centre AIIMS, New Delhi in partnership with Sewa Sadan Eye Hospital Bhopal conducted the survey. Dr. Sonal Gore and a team from Sewa Sadan Eye Hospital were part of the survey.

The soon-to-released findings of this survey will help form a base for eye care programmes in the state by identifying areas for prioritizing eye health.

Successful surgery saved sight of 45 days old Mahira



Sewa Sadan Eye Hospital has a fullfledged ROP unit. The ROP project of the hospital was launched with the support and efforts of Bengaluru based philanthropist Manu Chhatlani. BKT Foundation of Balkrishna Industries Mumbai donated Rs. 27 Lakh for Laser Machine and an Imaging Camera in SSEH.

A successful surgery at the Sewa Sadan Eye Hospital's retina department saved the sight of Mahira – a 45-day old preterm baby.

Mahira and her twin Meesha were born to a young couple Anikita and Sonu Soni in Bhopal. Anikita had a difficult pregnancy. The twins were born preterm, through cesarean in the eight months of pregnancy. They weighed a mere 1600 gms each. Two weeks after their birth, the babies were admitted to the Special Newborn Care Units (SNCU) of a referral hospital.

The parents who would have been enjoying the birth of their babies, were at the hospital caring for the babies who were fighting for their lives. After a month's treatment in the SNCU, the parents were advised to consult a retina specialist. The family's ordeal was yet not over.

The government district hospital at Sehore, neighbouring district of Bhopal referred Meesha and Mahira to Sewa Sadan Eye Hospital (SSEH) for retinal check up. Being low weight and having undergone treatment in SNCU, there could be a chance of RoP.

Pediatric retina specialist at SSEH, Dr. Sonal Paliwal assisted by Sr. retina optometrist Ajay Narwariya examined both babies. Fortunately, Meesha's eyes were fine. But Mahira was diagnosed with Retinopathy of Pre maturity (ROP).


Dr. Paliwal with her medical acumen immediately took a decision and performed laser procedure successfully. Today, Mahira is on the road to recovery.



Ocular prosthesis is an artificial eye, which is implanted in patients who have lost their eye due to various causes such as trauma, surgery, cancer, or in patients with shrunken damaged eyes, congenital absence or abnormally small-sized eyes with no visual potential. These conditions result in cosmetic disfigurement of the face which impacts patients psychologically and acts as a social stigma.

Cosmetic rehabilitation for these patients through the implantation of ocular prosthesis helps in restoring the patients' confidence by improving their external appearance. The Ocular prostheses are fitted behind the eyelids over a shrunken eyeball or an orbital implant placed following surgical removal of the eye.

The Ocular prosthetic Clinic at Sewa Sadan Eye Hospital is equipped with facilities with different types of ocular prosthesis and their implantation. Dr. Archana Bansal heads the department.

There was a rise in numbers for teleconsultation in the last two quarters at nearly 5000 plus cases. These cases are from 7 districts in the state where we made teleconsultation available through select vision centres.

Teleconsultation was introduced as a pilot project in 5 vision centres in 2019 in districts Sehore, Hoshangabad, Raisen and Rajgarh. During the COVID pandemic, the service was extremely useful.

Currently WhatsApp is used for sending the eye images of the patient to the ophthalmologist at the base hospital, Bhopal for consultation.

In some of the vision centres, fundus cameras have been introduced. Soon, this will be extended in one vision centres each in the districts where the teleconsultation is available.

Eye Screening Camps

At Sewa Sadan, we believe safe driving is vital to saving lives. On 14 February 2022, we organised a camp at Bharat Petroleum Corporation Limited by our Senior Optometrist Ajay Thakur. A total of 52 drivers were screened, 24 were advised spectacles and one was detected with cataract.

On 28 February 2022, an eye screening camp at the Central Prison, Bhopal was conducted. Nearly 200 prisoners were screened, of which 162 were found to have refractive error. The hospital distributed free specs. 60 were identified with cataracts. In the subsequent camp, the prisoners will be educated regarding the prevention of eye ailments.

Twin Camp for Eye & Dental

Sewa Sadan Eye Hospital and Sant Nirankari Mandal jointly organized a mega free eye & dental diagnostic camp at Sant Nirankari Satsang Bhawan, Jahangirabad Bhopal on 23 February 2022.

Outreach coordinator of SSEH Ms Sonam Vidhani, Shri Purshottam Mulani and Shri Ashok Juneja Zonal Manager of Nirankari Mandal were present.

451 patients were diagnosed with eye and dental problems. These included 289 eye patients. Sr. Dental surgeon Dr. Hansa Dudani examined 162 patients with various dental diseases.

Shri Ashok Juneja appreciated the cooperation of SSEH saying that a large number of urban poor benefit from free medical facilities in these camps.

Training PRI's



Four training programmes for PRI members was organised in our targeted intervention districts. The training was provided by senior optometrist.
