# **Meeting on Madhya Pradesh Universal Eye Health**



A state-level Madhya Pradesh Universal Eye Health consultation was organised by Sightsavers jointly with VISION 2020-The Right to Sight India in Bhopal, Madhya Pradesh on 29th October 2022. Sewa Sadan Eye Hospital participated in the one day meet.

This meet was intended to understand the changing landscape of public eye health issues in India and in specifically in Madhya Pradesh with challenges and opportunities ahead; to discuss state-specific issues, concerns, and scope of collaboration for future policy engagement and sector development and to discuss the scope of work and modalities for building a State Universal Eye Health Network/Alliance in the state.

Various sessions held were led by Shri RN Mohanty, CEO, Sightsavers and President, Vision 2020 India, Dr. Phanindra Babu Nukella, Chief Executive Officer, VISION 2020: The Right to Sight – India.

As a result of the meeting, a core committee will be formed for State Network on Universal Eye Health that would take lead in the state network functions.

## Vision 2020 India Central Zone members meet held

A meeting of the Central Zone members of VISION 2020 INDIA was held at Indira Gandhi Eye Hospital & Research Centre, Lucknow, Uttar Pradesh on 10th December 2022.

#### **Tanya Computer Lab Inaugurated**

A computer centre has been established at district Narmadapuram, Madhya Pradesh. The centre was inaugurated on 8th October 2022 by Col.(retd) Dr. Madan Deshpande, Consultant, SSEH. Shri. L.C. Janiyani, Managing Trustee SSEH, Ms. Jaishree Kumar, State Programme Lead of Sightsavers, Ashish Chatterjee and Kavita Salve were present on the occasion.





This wonderful initative is a joint project of Sewa Sadan Eye Hospital and INGO Sightsavers. Medicine Resource Foundation is also supporting the project.

Under the project, three month long free basic computer training will be imparted to the enrolled students. Two batches of 5 -5 students will receive training. The students will also be taught yoga.



# **Developing Master Trainers for School Screening**

Forty mobile resource co-ordinators, DIET teachers and school teachers were provided training for developing them as Master Trainers.



The training was inaugurated by District Program Coordinator Mr. Upadhyay.

Sewa Sadan Eye Hospital is committed to healthy eyes for children. With this aim, SSEH is collaborating with Sightsavers for "Vidyajyoti School Eye Health" programme.

Under the programme, the trained Master Trainers, will in turn train school teachers for school screening.

The focus of the program is on screening school students for eye problems and where required, prescribe spectacles, or provide treatment under RBSK scheme.



The programme was launched on 18th October at Raisen district, MP.

The second Thursday of every October is globally observed as World Sight Day for creating awareness among the general public on eye care, for advocacy with the policy makers. At SSEH, through a multi pronged approach, various sections of the society was reached with a message on eye care.

Managing Trustee, SSEH, Shri. L.C.Janiyani participated in a special programme on Doordarshan channel.

He emphasised that 80% of vision loss is preventable. A regular eye check up can detect an eye problem early and vision loss prevented. Shri Janiyani asked viewers to close their eyes for a moment to experience the dark world of the blind.
